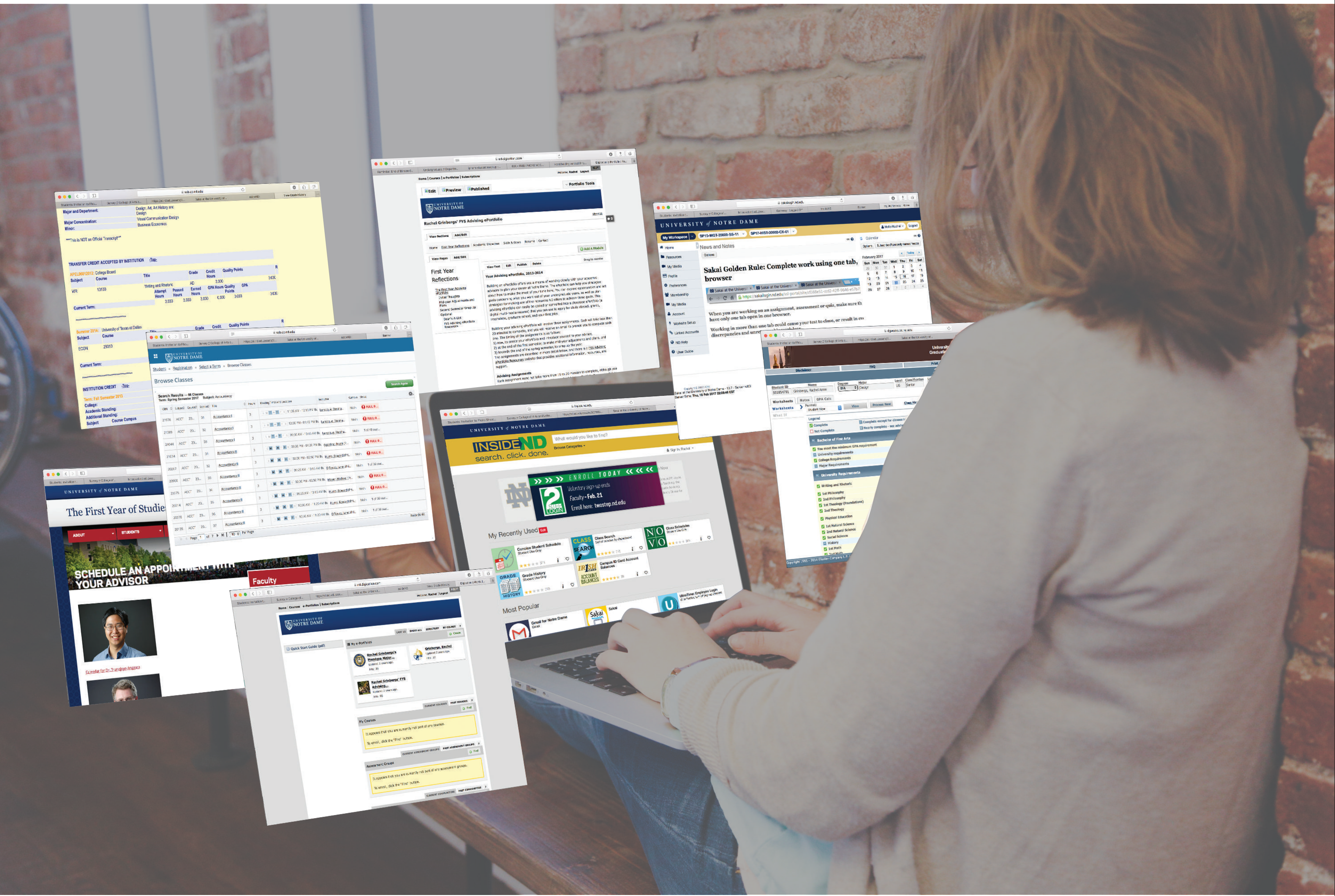


# THE CURRENT SYSTEM

Tools including GPS, class search and registration, and ePortfolio are outdated, do not reflect student needs, and have occasionally shown instances of miscommunicating critical information. These systems are all run and managed separately from each other, making them susceptible to error.

## LOCUS OF CONTROL

An internal locus of control has been proven to heavily contribute to a student’s success in college. Successful graduates have had clear goals, strong motivation, the ability to manage external demands, and self-empowerment.

“...successful students follow **distinct academic tracks[,] align their curricular choices with their goals and interests** and seek out **opportunities for personal growth and development** along the way.

They are able to use **strategic decision-making regarding course selections and academic integration** with the institution.”

“**Academic self-efficacy** and **organization and attention to study** were predictive of first-semester GPA...Other psychosocial variables that were predictive of college students’ life satisfaction included: **stress and time management, involvement** with college activity, and **emotional satisfaction with academics.**”
